Hello Everyone

We would like to take this opportunity to welcome all the children who have joined us from monkey room. They have all settled in well and have already started to make big strides in their development and already being able to find their peg and lunch label. Well done.

We have all been so busy since our last newsletter with lots of new themed activities and planning. Here are a few of our favourites:-

We looked at the Chinese New Year celebrations, we turned the home corner into a Chinese restaurant and the children enjoyed role playing and pretending they were cooking the different variety of Chinese foods. They also looked at Chinese symbols and read books about how Chinese new year is celebrated, this year being the year of the Dog.



The children have also experienced a themed week on measuring and shapes, all the children impressed us on their shape recognition and some looking at 3D shapes. Well done all. The children also had fun measuring themselves with tape measures and string to see who was the tallest. The boys got very competitive and some were even using props to make them selves taller!!

Measuring the children helped promote the children to talk to use mathematical language through their play and also helped support social development, as the children talked to each other as they compared themselves.

We also did two weeks concentrating on the book 'Handas Surprise', which was a massive hit with all the children. The home corner was turned into a fruit and vegetable shop, the children were pretending to measure the fruit and bagging the it up.

We also had a variety of fruit from the story laid out as a display so the children could explore the fruit themselves. The fruit was then used to help practice their gross motor skills by cutting up the fruit, but also using the chance to taste all the different fruits. We were very impressed how many of the children tried the guava and avocado. The children started to learn about African culture, looking at what they wear, travel and their homes and looking at how different their culture is to ours.

Rebecca- Over the last month my key group have been looking at number and letter recognition. This has been done through play or adult – led activities. Some of my key group have also shown an interest in telling the time, so we have been playing number recognition games, drawing clocks and asking the children to draw the lines to the correct numbers. I was so impressed with them all. Leading to a few who are using the clock throughout the day to tell me what time it is. Well done everyone.

Michaela - Since Christmas a lot of my older children have been looking at letters and the sounds they make, some have learnt to write their names and they are very proud of their achievement. Also we have been looking at numbers and different ways to use them, by adding more or having less. We have also been looking at groups and recognizing which have more objects in and those that have less.

Giraffe Room / Pre-Schoo

<u>Katie-</u> In my key group we have been doing lots of learning and building new relationships. We have all been looking at numbers and counting and all the children are improving in their counting, with lots now recognizing 1-5. A few of my children have also been learning about what happens when we mix different paint colours together and how we can use this for our play.

<u>Sophie</u> - Over the last month my key group have been focusing on letter recognition and formation. They have all done really well doing this and some even writing their names for the first time. well done. Some children in my group have also been interested in shape and space so we have done lots of fun activities focusing on their interests. My older children have been very helpful helping the new children settle in, either by cutting up their food or playing with them and having lots of fun!

Some of the older children described the texture as cold and wet - so very clever and brilliant description.

We also explored the changes of shaving foam and paint wrapped in cling film, for the children to touch and watch the changing effects, we enjoy these experiences as much as the children do I'm sure.

Another activity we have also played with is white rice and small world people in our sand tray to pretend it was snow, following the snowy days that we had! The children have loved exploring the play dough and work their gross motor skills. Some of the children have enjoyed washing babies with wet flannels and role-playing with them - so lovely to witness.
