Funding—We hope you are all aware of the Government's Tax Free Childcare Scheme, this is aimed at helping working parents with their childcare costs. For every £8 a parent puts into a childcare account, the government will top up their account with £2. Parents can receive up to £2'000 per child per year to pay for regulated childcare (£4'000 for disabled children)

Happy New Year everyone and welcome back to the second half of the winter terr

Firstly the team would like to congratulate Lindsey on becoming our Preschool Senior and secondly we would like to offer a big welcome to Emily joining us, sadly we have lost Lou to our Supply team but we do still see plenty of her! Thank you Lou for everything you have done for the team and all the children here in Preschool.

As usual we have been busy busy busy and not even the unsettled weather has stopped us as it gives us more inspiring ideas for the children to learn from and has given us lots of free resources.

Firstly after the New Year we looked at celebrating New Beginnings and Family Life. The children talked about their homes, and 'how many' people lived 'in' their house. We looked at different 'shapes' of houses by asking the children "What shape does your house look like"? The children then made their house from lolly pop sticks and drew pictures of their family inside their homes building up a story as their pictures transformed. All the time the children's vocabulary was being extended and new language learnt.

Next we looked at animal homes and the different habitats they live in. We looked at similarities and differences between the homes again extending new language and vocabulary. The children enjoyed the story about "The three little Pigs" and using various resources similar to the story we retold the story with props.

The children took a great interest in "Bees" using our Bee Bots, pictures of flowers, hives and honey. The flight of a Bee was programmed into the Bee Bot and positional language was used throughout the activity as the children worked together. "Be careful, " shouts one child as the Bee Bot moves near to them. The children demonstrated friendly behaviour; turn taking and sharing resources throughout this activity.

We also looked at different birds that we can see around our setting and using "toilet roll" Binoculars we searched the skies for different species, spotting and naming the familiar ones.

The children developed the outside by making steps to look over the fence as we very often see Red Kites hovering over the field next door.

During wellbeing week we listened to the story "The Colourful Monster". Different activities were set up for the children to express their feelings by using colours. By linking colours to feelings the children could tell the adults how they felt during that time. The children put some great thought into this as they had to go on scavenger

hunts to search for that colour within the room, and a couple came back with a handful of colours expressing the thought "I'm confused" with a new word they had learnt from the story.

During circle times we used different 'Breathing exercises such as Balloon and Shoulder Roll Breathing techniques, giggles were heard around the room as we attempted these. As we play the children learn all the time developing their abilities and experiences.

The unsettled weather over the last couple of weeks has given us lots of free resources

to explore outside. We left trays of water to freeze overnight some had animals in, some had natural resources in but the delight of squeals and laughter as the ice was broken told us this was a success. The children learnt ice was cold but if you put it in your pocket it would soon get warm and melt.

Pre-School

We have looked at different cultures by celebrating Chinese New Year. The children played with red and gold coloured rice scooping and pouring strengthening their middle core as they reached across the tuff tray. We

had soft animals from the Chinese zodiac and a story was told as to how it all

began.

Our curiosity cube was a huge hit again as various resources were displayed for the children to look and ask questions often being prompted by an adult for their understanding.

This week we celebrated Pancake Day using play dough, pots, pans and by moving the home corner kitchen into the back room the children in role play scenarios gave their

understanding of Pancake day at home. Lots of group activities initiated by the chil-

dren unfolded before us.

The next couple of months we will be looking at spring, new plants (seeds to care for and grow at home) and new born as the season changes and the weather hopefully warms up.

When we came back in January we spent some time looking at the celebration of

New Year! We made our own firework pictures and even had a mini party to celebrate our own 'New Years Eve'.

The children really enjoyed talking about the fireworks they had seen which prompted lots of discussion about the noises and the colours they are: In January we celebrated Burns night, we made and waved our own Scottish flags, tried some Scottish food such as oat-

cakes and 'neeps and tatties' with our lunch and also had a go at baking some shortbread. This was really good for supporting mathematical developments we had to count and weigh our ingredients.

For Australia Day we were able to use sponges to create our own coral reef pictures trying out a new painting technique, looked at some real Australian artifacts such as a boomerang and we even had a visit from an Australian animal—a bearded dragon called Balerion! Toran kindly brought him in and the children were so good and gentle, we were very careful with our handwashing too.

We have really enjoyed looking at all our different cultural celebrations in January.

In February we are having great fun looking at some of our favourite books such as 'The Tiger that came to Tea' and 'The 3 Little Pigs'

We made Tiger buns in case Tiger should come to tea and enjoyed a role-play picnic and made some houses for the 3 pigs, this all helped us to celebrate international reading week.

We have celebrated Chinese New Year recently by looking at traditional Chinese dragons and even had a go at some Chinese mark making! We have also spent some time looking at our emotions and talking about if we feel happy or sad, including what might make us feel happy again Great for our emotional development.

Hello,

We have been very busy and have really enjoyed many different celebrations recently. Since Christmas we have been able to use the Duckling room upstairs as an extra play space on Mondays, we have had all the soft play our to explore, enhancing our physical development and hare played in smaller groups developing our relationships with our peers.

In January we celebrated National Rubber Duck Day! The children enjoyed playing in the water trays, splashing the ducks in the water with their friends, using gross motor skills when painting duck cut outs that we then put on the board for them to appreciate.

We celebrated Burns night using different blue and white toys to represent the Scottish flag. The children progressed their mark making skills by using blue and white crayons, chalks and pencils. Julie bought in a book about Scotland so the children could look at the pictures from a different part of the UK with some of their different cultures.

With the weather being a bit wet we have taken the opportunity to explore lots of puddles!

Firstly, we cut out some real-life puddle pictures and stuck them on the floor indoors, this really encouraged us to jump and use our imaginations. We then had chance to take buckets of water outside and make more puddles on the patio that we could jump in and make real splashes! The buckets were quire heavy and we had to use our big muscles!

The puddle jumping then led on to Peppa Pig and muddy puddles. The children had pictures of Peppa Pig's family to colour in, we used this as an opportunity to talk about our families and who we live with. We have been creative and made a collage on a giant Peppa drawing and have also been cleaning 'mud' off Peppa's family using cloths

on our laminated pictures.

February is children's dental health month. We spent a week using toothbrushes for painting to enhance our hand to eye co-ordination. We really enjoyed using the toothbrushes to role-play cleaning the baby dolls teeth. This has helped the children to understand how to use a toothbrush and what it is for.

> The Penguin room children have shown a real interest in books again recently, our current display board is based around the Dear Zoo book as we have thoroughly enjoyed the animal and lifting the flaps in the books to find what is underneath.

> We have taken part in National Story-telling week by looking at our special adult led books every day. Our next book to focus on will be 'Up, Up, Up,' which is one of our new story CD's you may find it on You Tube. We will be creating some artwork to display to support our interest in this book – watch this space

We have been encouraging the children to learn to stop and go, creating boundaries by using our 'road tape' The tape and cars have been set up on both the floor and tables and we have based adult led activities around this to learn 'stop' and 'go' to support our personal, social and emotional development.

In the coming weeks there are many more celebrations for us to explore, such as Valentines Day where we will be exploring shapes such as a heart and sharing books about feelings. We will also be celebrating pancake day by creating our own felt pancakes and even tasting some real ones!

For Chinese New Year we are going to explore the Lion and create a display board together from this. We will be exploring moving our body by doing the dragon lion dancing. We will also be learning to say Happy New Year in different languages, exploring culture further.

We also have St David's Day, Mother's Day and World Book Day to look forward too.

It has been a very busy time for us in the Duckling room, we have enjoyed oh so many different activities and we have said hello to many new face, all the time


having fun. It all seems such a long time ago now, but did you see us really enjoying our Christmas crafts, we hoped most of them made it home in one piece.
